SAINT OF THE DAY

Saint Dominic Feast Day: August 8

Born in 1170 in a village in Old Castile, Spain, he was convinced of the need to restore the clergy to a life of austerity and piety and founded the Order of Preachers, popularly known as the Dominican Order, in Toulouse. The friars lived a life of itinerant preaching, mendicancy and intense study. He died in 1221 in his convent in Bologna and was canonized by Pope Gregory IX in 1234.

Sunday Series

St.Therese of Lisieux

Generations of Catholics have admired this young saint, called her the "Little Flower", and found in her short life, inspiration for their own lives.

Therese died when she was 24, after having lived as a cloistered Carmelite for less than ten years. She never went on missions, never founded a religious order, never performed great works. The only book of hers, published after her death, was a brief edited version of her journal called "Story of a Soul." (Collections of her letters and restored versions of her journals have been published recently.) But within 28 years of her death, the public demand was so great that she was canonized.

Therese was born in France in 1873, the pampered daughter of a mother who had wanted to be a saint and a father who had wanted to be monk. They eventually had nine children. The five children who lived were all



daughters, four of the daughters became Carmelites. Louis and Zelie Martin will be canonized on October 18, 2015. The first married couple to be made saints at the same time.

Therese's mother died when she was four and a half years old. Her sister Pauline became her second mother but five years later, Pauline entered the convent.. A few months later, Therese became so ill with a fever that people thought she was dying. When Therese saw her sisters praying to the statue of Mary in her room, Therese also prayed. She saw Mary smile at her and suddenly she was cured. Without realizing it, by the time she was eleven years old she had developed the habit of mental

Therese wanted to enter the convent. When the superior of the Carmelite convent refused to take Therese because she was so young, she went to the bishop, when the bishop said no, she asked the Pope in an audience in Rome. She was carried out by two of the guards! But the Vicar General was impressed by her courage and soon she was admitted to the convent.

Life as a Carmelite was not an easy one for Therese .She worried about her vocation; "I understood that Love comprised all vocations, that Love was everything, that it embraced all times and places...in a word, that it was eternal! Then in the excess of my delirious joy, I cried out: O Jesus, my Love...my vocation, at last I have found it...My vocation is Love!"

Then in 1896, she coughed up blood but did not tell anyone until she became so sick a year later everyone knew it. She died on September 30, 1897 at the age of 24 years old.

Therese's "little way" of trusting in Jesus to make her holy and relying on small daily sacrifices instead of great deeds appealed to the thousands of Catholics and others who were trying to find holiness in ordinary lives. By 1925 she had been canonized.

Therese of Lisieux is one of the patron saints of the missions, because of her special love of the missions, and the prayers and letters she gave in support of missionaries. This is a reminder to all of us who feel we can do nothing, that it is the little things that keep God's kingdom growing.
