With joy you will draw water at the fountain of salvation. — Isaiah 12:3

CELEBRATE

This Sunday, God rejoices and sings because of us. We read in Zephaniah today that God "will sing joyfully because of you, / as one sings at festivals" (Zephaniah 3:18). We know plenty about singing at festivals. Already our ears are ringing with the songs and carols that anticipate the Christmas season.

Paul reminds us of the source of our own double rejoicing: God is the mighty savior who is in our midst (in Zephaniah's words). Because this is so, says Paul, we can rejoice and be at ease. We don't have to worry, for God's peace will stand guard over our hearts and minds.

A medieval carol depicts Christmas as "my dancing day" and urges us to enter into the dance. Why all the merrymaking? Because "the Lord is near," as Paul reminds us (Philippians 4:5). He then points to another reason for the dancing: the dawn of the promise of peace, the peace beyond all understanding, that is now within our grasp.

Jubilee Year of Mercy Prayer of Pope Francis

Holy Father Pope Francis declared a Jubilee Year of Mercy starting on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mother Mary on December 8, 2015 and concluding on the Feast of Christ the King on 20 November 2016. Our Holy Father opened the Holy Door of Mercy in the Basilica of St. Peter on December 8, 2015, thus marking the official start of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. We, the faithful, are called to celebrate and live out the Year Mercy through liturgy, prayer, and corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

Prayer of Pope Francis for the Jubilee Year of Mercy

Lord Jesus Christ.

You have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this of vou. Lord Jesus. through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy; you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen

Financial Notes & Highlights: Statement of Operations for St. Barnabas

Financial Notes & Highlights

As part of the effort to improve financial transparency to the Parish, on a quarterly basis we will provide a financial update of the Statement of Operations to disclose the year to date financial condition of St. Barnabas. The Statement of Operations below lists the financial performance from July through September 2015, along with a comparison to the budget prepared at the start of the year to guide the management of the Parish.

The first quarter of the year continued the positive trend from the end of the prior fiscal year. Due to the generosity of the parishioners, total income was \$36,561 higher than anticipated. Expenses were \$7,574 higher than budgeted, however as the year progresses some of those costs will even out. As discussed previously in the bulletin and in Mass, St. Barnabas has also started to pay its full share of the Archdiocesan Assessment for the first time in many years.

We hope the rest of the 2015 – 2016 fiscal year continues this increased generation of income. We, the Priests, Finance Council, and the Pastoral Council, are deeply grateful for your love and generosity.
