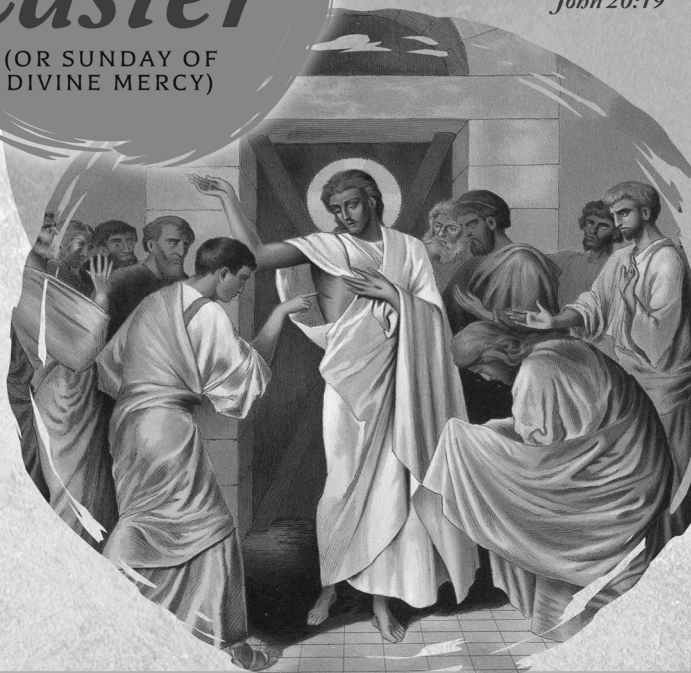

Good News!

April 28, 2019

Second Sunday of Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy (C)
Acts 5:12-16; Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19; Jn 20:19-31

We're not defined by our weakness, but created for greatness! Look at David, Paul, and the sinful woman. David was an adulterer and murderer, yet he wrote Psalms and was Jesus' ancestor. Paul killed one of the first deacons, Stephen, yet became the greatest apostle to the Gentiles. The sinful woman's misdeeds were public, yet what is most remembered is her repentance and love.

Sin is not the last word. God's recreating mercy is. God's mercy asks for a response so all that transformative power can be unleashed in us. The only thing that stands in the way of God's renewal rushing in and totally transforming us is our own lack of acceptance.

Sin wants to stand in the way of this good news. The evil one tries to convince us that we are too sinful; that salvation and happiness might be for others, but certainly not for us.

But David, Paul, and the sinful woman didn't let that sinister message sink in. David was moved to repentance by Nathan's words. Paul accepted that he wasn't saved by his religious fervor or condemned for his errors. He was saved by letting Christ's merciful love embrace him. The sinful woman refused to be defined by her poor choices. She tearfully made penance at Christ's feet, and this act of her brokenness gave off a consoling aroma that filled the house.

Let the power of Christ's love be unleashed in you by forgiving yourself and others. Then your weakness will be the first step toward the greatness God has in store for you.

EASTER BLESSINGS FROM OUR PASTOR

My Dear Parishioners,

Easter Blessings to you! We journeyed forty days of Lent in praying, fasting, and giving. This has been a time of spiritual reflections and renewal. For some of us, this Lent would have led to a greater spiritual awakening; for others, it may have reinforced our faith in Jesus, crucified and risen; and for some others it might have been a continued challenge to open one's heart and mind to spiritual enrichment. Regardless of our condition, the risen Christ makes his presence in our midst and invites us to encounter him. The purpose of encountering the risen Lord is to be 'amazed at what had happened' just like Peter did in the Gospel on Easter vigil (Luke 24:1-12), and to believe in Him as the Lord and Savior which leads us to the Sacramental life of the Church, and thus ultimately to our salvation as echoed by St. Paul in his letter to the Romans (Romans 6:3-11).

As we celebrate Christ's resurrection, may I invite you to ponder and reflect on the image of the 'empty tomb.' A couple of years ago I traveled with a group of our parishioners to the Holy Land, and had the blessing of celebrating Mass at the Holy Sepulcher, the tomb of Jesus. It was a life changing experience to stand in the very place where Jesus was laid to rest, and rose from the dead; and Mary Magdalene and the Apostles came and experienced firsthand the empty tomb. This would in turn pave the way to encounter their master when he appeared to them. As I was going back in time to relive those moments of Mary Magdalene and the apostles, I didn't realize that I was tuning out my surroundings, including those who were with me. I was emptying myself from the worldly cares and concerns and immersed in those moments of first eye witnesses of the empty tomb. We could perhaps learn a spiritual lesson that if we wanted to encounter the risen Christ in an intimate way, we need to tune out our preoccupied worldly cares and concerns, and empty our hearts and minds to let the risen Christ to come in.

In our parish, we recognize a number of individuals who embarked on this journey of emptying their hearts and minds from the worldly cares and concerns, and developed a desire to come closer to Christ through the faith formation process. We rejoice with all of our RCIA candidates and catechumens who are initiated into our faith life, our children in the Religious Education and the Parish School who receive their First Holy Communion, and our confirmation candidates who will be confirmed on May 18th, 2019. We congratulate them and pray that their desire to be with Jesus will continue to increase.

I extend a warm welcome to our brothers and sisters who have been away from our Catholic faith family. Welcome back to your home! I pray that you will rediscover the beauty of our faith life, and will make effort to be with us, particularly on Sundays, to worship and appreciate the Risen Christ in your lives.

I hope that it would not be an understatement to say that our parish community is active and vibrant. It is because of all of you, the regular parishioners, for your continued commitment to live out your faith in the risen Lord at every Mass we celebrate in our church. Thank you for your active participation not only in the Mass, but in various ministries of our parish as well. Further, your tremendous support to our parish with its financial needs is very much appreciated. Finally, your gracious presence in all walks of our parish life makes it a hospitable, warm, caring, and friendly community of faith.

In communion with our Priests, Pastoral and Finance Councils, and the Parish, School, Office Staff and Religious Education Staff, I extend my Easter Blessings to you and your loved ones!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An ancient title for this Sunday is *Dominica in Albis*, or "Sunday in White." During the Easter Vigil, the newly baptized are invested with a white garment, a sign that they have put on Christ. At one time, the garments were worn for a full week of celebration and reflection, and on this Sunday the newly baptized would appear in their robes again in their new place among the faithful for Eucharist.

In later centuries, the energy of new life at Easter was largely forgotten, and this Sunday was renamed "Quasimodo Sunday," or "Low Sunday." In recent years, with the recovery of the insight that Easter is the privileged time for celebrating and renewing baptism, there is nothing "Low" about this Sunday. At a week's distance, the beauty and grace of our Easter celebration is sustained by joyful alleluias, the blessing and sprinkling of holy water, and the comfort of the Lord's presence to us. He is risen, and he summons us together, opening up the scriptures for us, breaking the bread, filling us with new life.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: APRIL 28TH**COME TO THE FEAST OF DIVINE MERCY!**

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Sunday after Easter, the Octave Day of Easter. The feast day is observed by Roman Catholic as well as some Anglicans. It is originally based on the Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy that Saint Faustina Kowalska reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises from Jesus and indulgences issued by the Church.



The Divine Mercy image is a depiction of Jesus based on the devotion initiated by Saint Faustina Kowalska. "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish," Jesus told Faustina, according to her diary, which has been studied and authenticated...

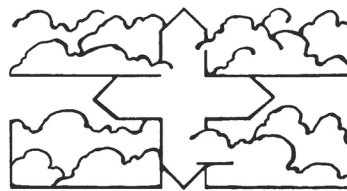
SECOND COLLECTION
