



June 27, 2021 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24; 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15 Mk 5:21-43 or 5:21-24, 35b-43

We operate under two very different economic systems. On one hand, in society the measure to which we claim a right is determined by the character and extent of our earning power. On the other hand, what is described in St. Paul's admonition to the Corinthians is more like the way economics operates in a family. There, need rather than earning power determines the measure of what we might claim as our right.

Both systems are built on important, though sometimes different, values. The prominent economic system in today's world advocates equality as the value upon which it is built. This includes equal pay for equal work, but also equality of opportunity. The system Paul advocates is built on issues of equity, which recognizes that all things are not equal. It insists that those who need more should get more. Both systems also face pitfalls. This could occur when a system based on equality does not operate on an "equal playing field." In such a situation, equality can lack justice. Then again, a system in which need or equity plays an important role must always be on the alert for idleness. Experience has shown that people have a tendency to take advantage of either system.

In an ideal system, both values operate. This is what Paul is actually advocating. He does not expect the rich to become poor. However, he does insist that as a matter of justice, and not charity, legitimate needs should be met. After all, we all are called to join the household of God.





PASTOR'S LETTER (June 15, 2021)

My Dear Parishioners,

Blessings to you! I pray that you are safe and healthy. We have endured the challenging time of this pandemic and we praise and thank God for keeping us safe/helping us recover.

As restrictions are gradually being lifted by government leaders, our Archbishop Jose Gomez, has sent us a letter on June 12, 2021, stating that beginning June 19, 2021, he is lifting most of the restrictions placed on our parish life. He is also **LIFTING THE DISPENSATION** from attending Mass for those who are in good health. Here is the statement of the Archbishop:

"By this letter, effective June 19, 2021, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic will be lifted for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. Those who have serious and legitimate reasons (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.,) are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation. In these cases, Pastors are to encourage the faithful to keep the Lord's Day holy by reading the Gospels, praying with their families, or joining themselves to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an Act of Spiritual Communion."

In light of this letter, may I welcome all parishioners who are not restricted by any health condition to return to church for Mass and other Sacraments, particularly for the Sunday Mass.

Please know that if you are not vaccinated yet, it is highly recommended that you wear a face mask for the safety of everyone. Some of you may not feel comfortable yet to celebrate Mass inside the church. Therefore, we will continue to have Mass under the tent until such time when it would not be necessary.

Beginning July 1, 2021, the Mass schedule will be as follows:

Saturday (Sunday vigil Mass): 5:00 pm (Inside Church)

Sunday: 7:00 am (Inside Church)

8:00 am (Under Tent)

9:00 am (Inside Church & Under Tent)

11:00 am (Inside Church)

Mon-Saturday: 7:00 am (Inside Church) Confessions, Saturday: 3:30-4:30 pm

We would also begin to allow in-person activities and use of parish facilities for various ministries in our parish. Kindly communicate with our parish office for your bookings.

Our parish office now welcomes in-person visits. In case if you are not vaccinated yet, it is recommended that you wear a face mask for the safety of everyone. Kindly visit our church website for further updates. I look forward to seeing you all. Welcome Home!

MINISTRY OF THE MONTH

CANA AT ST. BARNABAS

The CANA Marriage Renewal Movement (otherwise known as CANA) was established in 1998 by Fr. Tony Astudillo, then pastor of Holy Innocents Church in Long Beach. CANA was initially known as "Tuklasan sa Panginoon." Since then, CANA has grown close to seven hundred couples and spawned the establishment of other CANA communities in Walnut and as far away as San Diego.

When Fr. Tony was assigned to St. Lorenzo Church in Walnut, he caused a name change -- from "Tuklasan Marriage Spirituality and Family Ministry" to "CANA Marriage Renewal Movement" -- to emphasize the scriptural basis for his Theology of Relationships that underpins our CANA Marriage Spirituality, as well as to denote the deeper meaning and significance of this Marriage Spirituality Process. For all of CANA, the meaning of the CANA event (see John 2:1-11) is a deep, deep well from which we are invited to draw for the inspired response to the multitude of issues we encounter in the married state (which are, in fact, the necessary ingredients of the marriage relationship) and the labors that we engage in as a parish ministry.

CANA's principal purpose is to make known, and for the couple to experience, the active presence of God in their relationship as husband and wife. The first CANA Retreat took place in May 1998 in Torrance, California. The retreat was conducted for ten couples by an "Ecclesial Team" from the Philippines. Thereafter, the new encountered couples were formally endorsed to the spiritual directorship of Fr. Tony Astudillo, who was then the Pastor of Holy Innocents Church in Long Beach. It was at Holy Innocents that CANA took its initial name of "Tuklasan sa Panginoon" (Pilipino or Tagalog for "Encounter with and in the Lord"). By God's grace, Fr. Tony's remarkable and untiring work with Tuklasan sa Panginoon produced more than 400 couples at Holy Innocents where he installed Tuklasan as the matrix of all parish programs and, as such, main implementor of significant pastoral initiatives.

When Fr. Tony was assigned to St. Lorenzo Church in Walnut, he caused a name change -- from "Tuklasan Marriage Spirituality and Family Ministry" to "CANA Marriage Renewal Movement" to emphasize the scriptural basis for his Theology of Relationships that underpins our CANA Marriage Spirituality, as well as to denote the deeper meaning and significance of this Marriage Spirituality Process.

Through the years, CANA has expanded, advanced, and made more relevant its practice of Marriage Spirituality as it applies to marriage and family relationships and the over-all parish ministry of Evangelization, Sanctification, and Transformation.

Most importantly, CANA believes that these activities must be centered on the Eucharist not only because marriage is truly made perfect in the Eucharist but, above all, that the Eucharist is the clearest and most comprehensible image of God's own marriage covenant with His people. CANA calls us to the Eucharist, and as we live it, Eucharist becomes the hope and reality of who we are and must be by God's merciful design and purpose as individuals, as married couples, and as a people: "BECOMING" and "BEING" Eucharist to others is the

most basic means of loving and serving God at home, at work, in society, and in our parish community.

In 2018, Fr. Tony endorsed the CANA community of Long Beach and vicinities (still known locally as "Tuklasan sa Panginoon" or "Tuklasan") to Fr. Antony Gaspar, pastor of St. Barnabas, who warmly welcomed CANA to the parish.

We would also like to acknowledge and thank CANA Ministry for the wonderful landscaping they did inside our main parking lot planters. (with the collaboration with Knights of Columbus!) Please take time to stop by and see it for yourself! It's very happy and welcoming!

This week is the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. Why doesn't each have his own feast day?

They do. Saints Peter and Paul are united in a solemnity on June 29 to honor their martyrdom, but each has his own feast: the Chair of St. Peter (February 22) and the Conversion of St. Paul (January 25).

Peter's primacy is evident in the prominence given to him by the Gospel writers and in the position of authority entrusted to him in the infant Church. Jesus promised Peter that he alone would be the foundation stone, keeper of the keys, and head shepherd (see Matthew 16:18–19 and John 21:15–17). Peter also oversaw Judas Iscariot's replacement (see Acts of the Apostles 1:15–26).


Paul holds a position of honor for his transformation from Church persecutor to "a slave of Christ Jesus" (Romans 1:1).

Saint Augustine wrote that they share a solemnity because, even though they didn't suffer on the same day, they suffered as one. On different days of presumably the same year, 67, Peter was crucified and Paul beheaded.

Their esteem coupled them in the early Church's devotion. Hence, the solemnity Mass preface states that "each in a different way gathered together the one family of Christ; and revered together throughout the world, they share one Martyr's crown."
